Pastor's Words - A Committed Life

From July to September, the theme for our church is "commitment". The church hopes that all brothers and sisters live a committed life. Without committed believers, it does not matter how many high quality gatherings or trainings the church has, the church will not revive or grow. So what is a committed life? A committed life includes both a commitment to God and to the community. Today, I want us to focus on the commitment to God.

Committed to God

Many believers who have decided to follow Jesus realise a few months later, that their lives are no different to (if not worse than!) the ones they were living when they were still non-believers So they come to a false conclusion that they are not sincere enough. But in fact, the real reason is that they do not know the meaning of being committed to God. To receive the abundant life that God has promised, we have to be wholly committed to God, and that means that we have to hand over our entire lives to God. Let us think carefully about what Jesus said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it." (Luke 9:23-24)

Take note that there is no place for negotiation. Jesus said: "My commitment to you is wholly. I have forsaken everything for you, including my life to save yours. Will you do the same for me? I can promise you that you will not regret to say yes, but there is a great price that comes with it!" Jesus asks for the centre of our lives to be renewed and changed. Being self-centred is the nature of our earthly lives. But Jesus asks us to "forget about it" and "put ourselves aside". This is like placing all your money into one bank account and giving God a blank cheque. God can use the cheque in 24 hours, take away all your funds, and at the end of the day, ask you to be a martyr for Him. But God will not do that. He will lead us step by step to live a committed life. For example, the first step is for us to be determined to pray, read the Bible, and leave time aside to build a relationship with God every day. The second step may be for us to be determined to farewell our bad habits or environments. The third step may be for us use our gifts to serve God, etc. God will lead us step by step until we begin to understand that our lives have already been offered up to Him as living sacrifices. But how many of us are willing to be committed to God like this and have the courage to put God above everything else?

Experience tells me that God has demands for all of us. But he is definitely patient and kind, and He will wait until we are ready.

A pastor and his wife drove past an unattractive town, and they said to each other: "Hopefully, we will never ever have to set foot on this town again. It will be miserable." But a few years later, God called them to work in this town. They were surprised that not only do they have the determination to move forward with the idea, they were able to settle down happily after their arrival. This is living a committed life.

To be committed is to be completely obedient to God's Word, His guidance, and His arrangement. This is not being obedient out of helplessness, but being obedient with a joyful heart. Brothers and sisters, the church God arranged for you may not be your

favourite church; the work or ministry that God puts you in may not be one that you like; your family and the brothers and sisters in Christ God wants you to serve may cause you discomfort; but if we are really committed to God, we have to be completely obedient and joyful in the church and position that God places us in, and accomplish the mission, entrustment and the work that God has given to us. Brothers and sisters, are you ready to be committed to God?

Committing to Christ

Life is full of commitments. Think about it. There are commitments to Parents, Family, work, politics, etc. and those types of commitments are universally expected. Nothing unique about that. Some are more committed than others depending on the nurturing and environment of an individual.

We live in worlds within worlds. There is a sporting world, entertainment world, university world, medical world, and many more. Commitment is found within these worlds too. There has to be a focus to that commitment to achieve results but it does not change the character of the committed one and it profits nothing in or for Eternity.

It is the Holy Spirit that reveals Jesus Christ to an individual. It is necessary to explain who Jesus is and the reason for Him coming to earth. The challenge is given by the Holy Spirit to explain the need of confession and repentance of sin. The amazing love of God sending is Son to take our punishment and to become a follower of Jesus Christ. These are the claims that Christ makes upon the life.

There must always be given a clear exposure and explanation about who Jesus Christ is and the purpose of His 33 years on earth. There cannot be an expectation of anyone responding well to the Gospel without clearly telling the complete story of who Jesus is.

There is an obligation to the hearer to give a clear message about Jesus and Eternity, from the Word of God (the Bible) that there is no doubt, in the mind, that truth has been spoken and heard. To clearly explain what being Born Again by the Holy Spirit means.

The Holy Spirit then works on the Inquirer from what has been shared in the Word of God, that He draws the sinner to repent, forgive and commit their life to Christ. A sinner has accepted Jesus by the Holy Spirit and is now saved for Eternity by the Grace of God.

A transformation should take place. Moving from Darkness into the Glorious Light of Jesus. This is the first step of Commitment to Jesus Christ. Reading the Word and praying should become important. The commitment to Jesus should give to the one, (now a sinner saved by Grace), an improvement on other commitments or responsibilities affecting the life. The real purpose for being on earth will become clear. Christ will now live His live in and through the new follower to reach the people who are still in darkness. There will be a challenge from Satan to try and defeat the believer in subtle ways, so a strong commitment is needed to stay focused on Jesus.

Those who claim to be born again, a sacrificial commitment is needed, so that the evidence is seen by being overcomers, victorious, steadfast and faithful in this life.

1 John 5 -4, "for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith." Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

Rev. 3-21, "To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with my Father on his throne."

Revelation 21-7, "Those who are victorious will inherit all this, and I will be their God and they will be my children."

Without a doubt, the worship team is responsible for leading songs, but the cooperation with others such as sound team, power point team and members of the worship team are essential in creating a good atmosphere.

In a recent meeting of the Worship Ministry, we discussed how to provide a better worship experience, how to improve the quality of music and singing, and the coordination with the other ministries... etc. The congregation could actually participate in this ministry indirectly by providing us feedback. We value and love to hear your opinion as it will be helpful for the future worship sessions.

I really hope that we can all work together to please God every Sunday, and at the same time help every member of the congregation experience a resounding worship in His temple!

Sharing on "Discipline to Pray"*

The first sub-theme topical course, "Discipline to Pray", has been completed satisfactorily. This is one of the courses under the Believers' Equipping Program for Spiritual Maturity. Rev. Li trained us, in 3 sessions, to discipline our praying.

1st Session: "Spiritual Men and Praying"

The spiritual focus of modern men is on "themselves" i.e. they are always concerned about their inside worlds and ignore other people. Rev. Li told us that we should focus our spiritual discipline on the Christ Himself. We should find a quiet place to relax, breathe deeply and unload all our worries and burdens to God. We should pray that Jesus would enter into our lives and vice versa. We should encounter God by ourselves, follow His instructions, live as children of light, lift. up Jesus in our life and witness Him. A person who has truly experienced God would fear God, know His will and let the Christ control his life.

2nd Session: "Praying with Love"

Love and relationship have to be nurtured. We need to take time to be with God so that our and His hearts will be closer. We will long for God when we realise that we are so poor and our hearts are so desolate. If you really love someone, you would spend time with this person and would be thirsty to be closer to him/her. Likewise, we must have the motivation to come closer to God, because His love is so deep and wide. After listening to God's word, we should spend time to reflect,

to pray and to live out His truth in our daily lives. We should also spend time to communicate with Christ spiritually, like the bride who deeply longs for God.

3rd Session: "Praying & Self-counselling"

We should give ourselves as Jesus did. This does not mean that we should be detached from the real world and practicing penance and abstinence in our daily lives. We should truly deal with our "self", give up our self-centredness, take our cross to follow Jesus, and discipline our spirituality daily. At the end of each day, we should take time to reflect and practice the "Prayer of Examen" in the following 3 steps:

We should give thanks to God for the daily guidance by Holy Spirit, and for our willingness to obey God and live a Godpleasing life.

We should unload our pressures and burdens to God and pray that He will lead us to go forward.

We should reflect if we have any self-centred behaviours and any sins against God or other people. If so, we should admit our sins and repent.

Through self-reflection we inspect our strengths, spiritual gifts and shortcomings for improvement. We should accept ourselves so that we can have a true and close relationship with God; accept others so that we get along well with others.

After my retirement, I left Hong Kong for the United States and lived there for 10 years (from 2001 to 2010) until a sudden change in my family – my son died in an accident when he was diving. Therefore, I migrated again to Australia to reunion with my daughter and son-in-law.

In 2008, I was suffered from prostate cancer. Being a citizen of the United States, I received free medical services including treatment, tests, chemotherapy and radiotherapy, under the care of 3 doctors. After all these procedures, the doctors said that they could not guarantee a complete elimination of all cancer cells. However, the test result revealed that the cancer cell count was almost zero. Therefore, the doctors said that I was recovered and should be under observation for 5 years. I am now 89 years old, living beyond the observation period of 5 years set by the doctor.

Now I have liver cancer, which has been existing in my body without any pain. This is God's blessing. I am still able to have

leisure walking and eat what I want to eat. All these are God's graces. For brothers and sisters who have suffered from similar illnesses, I hope that you can rely on the power and peace given by God to overcome your physical problems like me.



Thanks to Rev. Li, Mrs. Li, brothers and sisters for your caring messages and prayers. How wonderful is the power of prayers! I pray that God will give me more chances to serve Him. As I was not highly educated when I was young, I am willing to learn God's word from brothers and sisters. It is my wish that I can continue to know God and serve Him.
